

Bhiwani, October 01 : For the smooth and copying free conduct of the Semester Examinations, 258 flying squads have been formed as a part of the large-scale arrangements made by the Board of School Education Haryana. Examination duty has been made compulsory and no changes will be allowed in this regard. These Examinations are commencing from October three.

Disclosing this the Board Secretary Mr. Shekhar Vidyarthi, I.A.S. gave details of the arrangements and told that 1646 Examination Centres had been set up in the state for 8 lakh 31 thousand and 898 candidates. He informed that 4,66,357 candidates of Secondary, 3,53,953 candidates of Senior Secondary and 11,588 candidates of Haryana Open School (Reappear of First and Second Semester) would be appearing in these Examinations. He said that 1646 Centre Superintendents had been deputed on Examination duty. Police personnel in adequate numbers had been deputed outside the Examination Centres to check outside interference.

The Secretary informed that for checking copying and use of other unfairmeans 258 flying squads had been constituted which included 21 squads of Deputy Commissioners, 52 squads of Sub-divisional officers (Civil), 21 squads of District Education Officers, 52 squads of Block Education officers, 21 District Question papers squads, 31 sub-divisional Question Paper flying squads, 20 Rapid Action Force and 21 Special Task Force, 05 Control Room flying squads, flying squads of Board Members, Chairperson , Secretary , Director, Deputy Secretary and Assistant Secretaries of the Board.

Mr. Vidyarthi further told that five Control Rooms at Rohtak, Gurgaon, Fatehabad, Kurukshetra and Bhiwani had been set up for effective monitoring of conduct of Examinations.

The Secretary further informed that section-144 Cr.P.C had been imposed around 200 meters of Examination Centres to check outside disturbance by district administration in the State.
